The College works with a range of prestigious companies and organisations including The Royal Opera House, the National Theatre, Canterbury Cathedral, The Canal and River Trust, Blou and TMJ and has prepared students for careers involving the conservation of well-known heritage sites such as The Palace of Westminster, Westminster Abbey, Buckingham Palace, Kensington Palace and The Royal Naval College, Greenwich. Constituted as an educational charity, the College is governed and financially supported by the Worshipful Company of Carpenters. It enjoys a thriving student population and a strong portfolio of employer and business contacts and has the ambition and strength to create a lasting difference in the local communities it serves, and beyond. It relocated to its current site in Stratford, East London, in 2001 and derives its annual income from public and charitable sources along with fees.

As part of a strategy of growth and development the College is now looking to appoint a suitably qualified and experienced Specialist Tutor in Wood and Technician to be based at our Kennard Road Campus. Salary will be competitive. The successful candidate should hold a specialist wood qualification or a degree and possibly a teaching qualification and have a record of significant and recognised achievement in Fine Wood Work, joinery and furniture making skills as well as excellent wood machining skills and

extensive knowledge of specialist wood machines and their maintenance and upkeep.

Reporting directly to the Head of Fine Wood Work the successful candidate will be a highly skilled practitioner who will have the opportunity to work directly with a broader team of specialist colleagues. S/he will deliver high level, joinery and furniture making skills to a variety of different students from young learners to career-changers. S/he will carry out, assist and supervise the maintenance of woodworking machinery, equipment and facilitate the running of the workshops. S/he will have responsibility for liaising directly with business partners and for generating new business contacts with a view to increasing student uptake on our Fine Wood Work courses.

To be successful in this role, candidates will also be expected to monitor and track the performance of students and deal effectively with employers. Excellent communication, administration and interpersonal skills together with flexibility and a commitment to working proactively and creatively as part of a team are essential qualities for the role.

Job Description

Specialist Tutor in Wood and Technician

Responsible to: The Head of Fine Wood Work, the CMT and ultimately the Principal

Principal Responsibilities:

General Responsibilities Related to the Role of Specialist Wood Tutor and Technician

1. Under the direction of, and in consultation with, the Head of Fine Wood Work to contribute to aspects of the delivery of the Fine Wood Work course, including but not limited to:
 - Delivering course modules
 - Preparing teaching materials
 - Assisting students in the workshops and wood mills
 - Carrying out assessment of practical and theory work
 - Developing course projects
 - Course administration
 - General tutor duties

2. Assisting the Fine Wood Work and Bench Joinery teams with the following;
 - Maintenance of woodworking machinery
 - Maintenance of wood mill equipment
 - Ordering of workshop tools and machine tooling
 - Ordering of course materials from suppliers. (e.g. timber and sheet materials)
 - Liaising with machine maintenance and blade sharpening contractors
 - Updating / maintaining workshop equipment and facilities
 - Preparing materials for students

- Liaising with staff and students with regard to the above
3. To assist with the day-to-day maintenance of specialist machinery and training of staff and students in its safe use.
 4. To maintain a high standard of professional commitment.
 5. To co-operate and liaise with fellow staff from each department for the good of the students and of the College.
 6. To contribute to the overall life of the whole College.

- Excellent wood machining skills and extensive knowledge of specialist wood machines and their maintenance and upkeep
- Ability to train in the maintenance of specialist wood machinery
- Excellent organisational and planning skills with strong attention to detail and accuracy
- Ability to deal with students at all levels
- Integrity, tact, loyalty and diplomacy
- A flexible, proactive approach to work with the ability to manage multiple tasks and deadlines
- Excellent communication skills and the ability to build relationships with colleagues, parents and apprentices and employers

- Good literacy skills to prepare correspondence and reports and maintain records to a high standard
- Strong IT skills to include MS Outlook, Word and Excel
- An appreciation of College life, ideally in an inner-city FE setting
